




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

Genius Loci - Symphony for Absent Wildlife, 2014. Pencil, pigment ink, water colour on Fabriano paper, 56 x 67 cm




In these words of Lucy and Jorge Orta in the book *Fabulae Romanae*, published on the occasion of the exhibition of the same name promoted by ZegnaArt at the MAXXI in Rome in 2012, there is not just the social poetics of an art that worms its way into the recesses of hidden realities and stirs our consciences, but a deliberate militancy that takes them each time into places torn by contemporary conflicts. It is on this attention to life, on the sharing of a series of concrete and inescapable values, that a collaboration between Lucy + Jorge Orta and the Zegna family has been constructed; a collaboration in which the paths of beauty have been united with those of the good and the useful. *Fabulae Naturae* is the next stage of *Fabulae Romanae*. The *Spirits* that in Rome wandered around the city like symbolic figures have been transformed in Milan into mythological creatures that allude to the animals of the woods and act with their presence and their chant like the choruses in Greek tragedy.

So Lucy + Jorge Orta's *Fabulae Naturae* inserts itself into the Zegna Headquarters in Milan with a series of actions that explore and reconfigure the spaces of design and work. It is from Lucy Orta's exploration of the Zegna Archives at Trivero, from her hours of research in the Fondo Heberlein, that came the inspiration for the luminous floral panels, a sort of showcase of today set in the architecture of Via Savona, where the action of *The Meal Act* unfolds, linking up with the theme of EXPO 2015. And it is precisely that idea of feeding the planet, of taking care of the land, which has led to the production in a limited edition of a series of plates on which the flowers of the Zegna Archives—Fondo Heberlein have again served as inspiration for the artists, who have turned them into a set of marvelous fragments of nature. And one that will bring, through their sale and the collaboration with the Fondo Ambiente Italiano (FAI), the luxuriance of nature back to Punta Mesco. Thus the geography of the space in Milan becomes an emotional map that is grafted onto and completes the objective one.


